Learning to Walk with God:

A Series Based on Abraham in Genesis 12–25

Part Four: Helping Others Walk as You Walk, Genesis 14

The average person learns to walk at the age of one, but learning to walk with God is different, perhaps harder. How would your life be better if you walked more closely with God? We learn in this series from the example of Abraham in Genesis 12-25. We continue in Part Four this week with helping others walk as you walk. Read Genesis 14.

Lot had made a terrible decision to move his family east near the city of Sodom, and when the Sodom king (along with four other kings) were defeated by four kings from the east, Lot and his family were swept up in the carnage. Abraham would be the one to reach out and help Lot, but what questions should he have been asking before reaching out? What questions should we be asking as well?

Is God positioning you to do this?

Is God providing for you to do this?

Is God receiving praise from you through this?

Questions for Group Discussion:

1. Do you agree that walking with God should be done in community? Why?
2. Why was Abraham able to experience peace in the midst of conflict?
3. What questions would you have been asking before helping Lot?
4. Describe what it means to help others walk as you walk with God.
5. In what ways are you establishing healthy boundaries for God and yourself?
6. Describe a time when you stepped out in faith despite unfavorable odds.
7. Is there ever a time when helping doesn't help? How is that determined?
8. How can you use your current relationships as an opportunity to worship?

Final Thoughts and Closing Prayer:

What will I do to worship God more in my walk with Him this week?

How will I live better and help others do the same because of this study?
